Comments:

Image 1: Unbalanced exposure. Background is properly exposed but subject is overexposed. Light should have been turned down in order to reduce the amount of light on the subject. Utilize camera highlight function and hoodman loope to gauge proper exposure. Also, baseball cap should have been pulled up so it's not obscuring subjects eyes. Good job getting a great facial expression!

Image 2: Unbalanced exposure. Subject is properly lit but background exposure is too dark. Adjust shutter speed to compensate for the low light/dark background. When shooting outdoors, refer to the "Shutter Speed Reference Chart" to determine correct shutter speed for current lighting condition. Cropping and framing are very nice on this one!

Image 3: Unbalanced exposure. Subject exposure is okay (if not a little dark), but background is overexposed. Adjust shutter speed to compensate for the light background. Refer to the "Shutter Speed Reference Chart" to determine correct shutter speed for current lighting condition. Slightly increase power of light if subject is underexposed. Also, have subject lower bat to rest on shoulder.

Image 4: Posing is inconsistent. Make sure subject is standing up straight and make sure bat is resting on the shoulder. Good job balancing the exposure!

Comments:

Image 1: Group is off center and coaches should have been kneeling. Kneeling the coaches would have allowed you to crop in closer, thus reducing the amount of dead space in the image. Kids are posed very nicely in the image however.

Image 2: Group is slightly off center and back row of group is off center. The back row should have been moved slightly to the right (photographer's perspective). This would have balanced out the group pose a bit more.

Summary:

Overall you have shown great improvement since the beginning of the season! Your cropping and framing are much improved. Your ability and comfort level working with the kids has improved also. We still have a little more work to do dialing in exposure when shooting outdoors, but even that has improved tremendously since the beginning of the season. I appreciate your hard work this season. Keep up the good work!
